

Decentralisation of Solid Waste Management, Yemen

Project Description

The German Ministry for Economic Development and Co-operation (BMZ) supports Yemeni Authorities since September 1995 with a technical assistance project with the aim to improve solid waste management in Yemen. The main focus of the German contribution is to support the Republic of Yemen with regard to the decentralisation of solid waste management to local authorities including training of personnel and the development of regulations and guidelines in the solid waste sector.

Infrastruktur & Umwelt was commissioned by GTZ to implement the German contribution, starting in 11/2000.

- Decentralisation of solid waste management to local authorities,
- Development of regulations and guidelines in the solid waste sector.
- A sector wide approach for Solid Waste Management under an agreed strategy is established
